



This week in Maths, P5 and P5/4 have been focussing on weight and the relationship between grams and kilograms. They have been learning how to read and use scales, as well as how to express how much items weigh in different forms, including fractions of a kilogram.

In literacy, as part of our new science topic on coral reef ecosystems, the children have been creating mind maps of what they already know and what they are learning about coral reefs. They have been finding out about the environmental importance of the coral reef ecosystem and the roles played in it, and have enjoyed creating coral reef food webs.

Individual presentations on countries of the world have continued this week. All three classes have enjoyed learning facts about lots of different places, and the children have been developing their peer assessment skills by offering constructive feedback based on the class rubrics created. A huge 'well done!' to all those children who worked hard to research and present on their chosen country as part of their home learning. The standard has been very high.
